Oneida Nation School System Grant Application to Office of Indian Education Programs -Bureau of Indian Affairs, Consolidated School Reform Plan

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has determined as part of its Seventh Generation Commitment, "To develop a provisional system that fits our "family"/community values such as food, shelter, clothing and education as well as other services," and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Nation School System for its most cherished responsibility—education of our children—to renew and revitalize the dignity of and harmony amongst Oneida People, in accordance with Oneida's need for cultural survival and well-being, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin continues to supports the Oneida Nation School System five year plan which follows the new Public Law 107-110, No Child Left Behind legislation, and;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submits a grant application to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the Consolidated School Reform Plan' grant for the purposes of improving teaching and learning, integrating Oneida language and culture into the curriculum, as well as, raising academic levels.
