WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has determined its mission for the Oneida Community Health Center/Dental Clinic is to "provide a vital component of holistic health by working together as a team to guarantee quality dental care and improve the quality of life for the future of the Oneida Community", and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe through the Oneida Dental Clinic would like to provide culturally sensitive, community based dental services for Oneida community families, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida Family and Community will be strengthened by providing critically needed services that will have a positive impact on family and elders/ health and healing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin/Oneida Community Health Center/Dental Clinic Program in collaboration with the Public Welfare Foundation, authorizes and submits this grant application for a critically needed Dental Elder Clinic which will provide complete dentures to our elder population, as defined as those sixty-five years of age and older.
