RESOLUTION # <u>3-05-03-D</u> 2003 ROAD CONSTRUCTION PRIORITY PROJECTS ONEIDA NATION-BIA ROAD SYSTEM

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribe Constitution by the Oneida General Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation, as part of its ongoing process of Transportation Improvement Program Planning, has identified road construction priority projects; and,
- WHEREAS, the road construction priority projects are identified on the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP/Control schedule) which is attached hereto and made part hereof as Attachment A; and,
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin has identified that implementation of these road construction priority improvements will enhance safety of travel on the Reservation, economic development, housing and the general welfare of the Tribe;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: The Oneida Nation Business Committee does hereby request that the Bureau of Indian Affairs add the 2003 Road Construction Priority projects, identified herein and attached hereto, to the BIA Indian Reservation Roads System for programming of funding for transportation infrastructure planning, engineering, design and construction.
