BC RESOLUTION # <u>9-24-03-A</u> Emergency Adoption of the All-Terrain Vehicle Law

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, there have been reports of unsafe all-terrain vehicle use and reports individuals of obstructing trails to harass and discourage those riding all-terrain vehicles; and
- WHEREAS, Article VI of the Administrative Procedure Act authorizes the Business Committee to enact legislation on an emergency basis, to be in effect for a period of six months, renewable for an additional six months; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee finds that the lack of regulations for all-terrain vehicles constitute an emergency situation which requires the immediate passage of the All-Terrain Vehicle Law; and
- WHEREAS, emergency adoption of the All-Terrain Vehicle Law is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare of the reservation population, and that observance of the regular APA adoption requirements for passage of laws would be contrary to public interest.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the attached All-Terrain Vehicle Law is hereby adopted on an emergency basis.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the All-Terrain Vehicle Law shall be effective immediately and remain in effect for six (6) months unless extended by the Oneida Business Committee for an additional six (6) months.
