### MONEY JUDGEMENT

This case has come before the Oneida Trial Court, Honorable John E. Powless III presiding.

Appearing in-person: Chantell Vanden Bloomer, Petitioner, Kevin Vanden Bloomer and Julie Cornelius, Defendant.

### Background

On April 27, 2022, Petitioner filed a civil small claim complaint requesting payment of veterinarian bills stemming from an alleged attack involving Defendant's dogs on March 23, 2022. A pre-trial hearing was held June 1, 2022.

### **Findings of Fact**

The Court finds as follows:

- 1. The Court has subject matter, territorial, and personal jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Notice was given to all those entitled to notice.
- 3. On March 23, 2022, Respondent's two German Shepherds entered Petitioner's yard and proceeded to attack Petitioner's Beagle.
  - a. As a result, Petitioner's Beagle sustained multiple lacerations stemming from the attack.
  - b. The Defendant did not dispute she is the owner of the German Shepherds.
- 4. On April 27, 2022, Petitioner filed a civil small claims complaint to the Trial Court seeking monetary relief for veterinarian bill sustained from attack.
- 5. On June 1, 2022, a pre-trial hearing was held.
  - a. The parties were offered Peacemaking, Petitioner declined.
- 6. At the pre-trial hearing, the parties agreed to the following:
  - a. Defendant admitted that her two German Shepherds attacked Petitioner's Beagle.
  - b. Defendant agreed to pay \$1,035.80 in veterinarian bills as a result of the attack.
  - c. Parties agree Defendant will pay Petitioner \$100.00 each week until the total amount of \$1,085.80 is paid in full.

- i. Parties agree payments will be made every Wednesday, starting June 8, 2022.
- ii. Parties will further mutually agree to an acceptable method of payment.
- iii. Parties agree upon a cash payment, Petitioner will provide a written receipt to Defendant documenting payment.
- iv. Upon satisfaction of the total debt, Petitioner will provide a notice of satisfaction to Defendant and the Court.
- 7. The Court finds the parties' agreement reasonable.

# **Analysis**

At the pre-trial hearing, the Defendant provided a verbal response to Petitioner's complaint, admitting her German Shepherds Yaeya and Rosie attacked Petitioner's Beagle, Chase. As a result of the attack, Chase sustained multiple lacerations requiring immediate medical attention. Defendant agreed to pay for the veterinarian bills from the attack, \$1,035.80 and Petitioner is also entitled to court costs. The parties agreed to a weekly Wednesday payment of \$100.00, starting June 8, 2022. The parties will further mutually agree to an acceptable method of payment. Last, upon Defendant satisfying the total amount owed, Petitioner will submit a final receipt that the total amount owed is satisfied to the Defendant and the Court.

## Order

The Court orders as follows:

- 1. The Court accepts Defendant's admission that her German Shepherds attacked Petitioner's Beagle and as a result, liable for Petitioner's veterinarian medical bills.
- 2. A final judgment is entered in favor of the Petitioner against the Defendant in the amount as follows:

Veterinarian/Medical bill	\$1,035.80
Court Costs	\$50.00

# Total Amount Owed by Defendant \$1,085.80

- 3. Defendant is ordered to pay Petitioner \$100.00 every Wednesday, starting June 8, 2022, until the total debt of \$1,085.80 is satisfied.
  - a. Upon Defendant satisfying this debt, Petitioner is ordered to provide a notice of satisfaction to Defendant and the Court.

## IT IS SO ORDERED.
