NOTICE OF CONTINUING GUIDANCE FOR COVID-19
PRECAUTIONS
(Effective June 2023)**

The Oneida Judiciary is issuing the following continuing guidance as a precautionary measure to limit the spread of COVID-19 and its variants. The Court supports continued and sustainable public health practices to keep court users and court staff safe.

- The courthouse lobby remains open and accessible for walk-in court services such as obtaining court papers, court filings, Notary services, etc. Any change in status will be noticed on the Judiciary's website at <https://oneida-nsn.gov/government/judiciary/>, Update Oneida, and/or the Oneida Nation's website.
- The Court will continue to offer a mix of in-person hearings, virtual hearings, and telephone hearings. In addition, Peacemaking sessions are a mix of in-person sessions, virtual sessions, and/or telephone session.
- If you have a hearing or Peacemaking session scheduled with the Court, please review your Notice of Hearing or other direction to know how you are scheduled.
- The Court supports social distancing practices, hand washing, and wiping down frequently touched surfaces. Social distancing guides are placed throughout the facility to indicate where individuals may stand for security screenings and Reception service. Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the courthouse.
- Anyone with a fever, cough, or other common COVID-19 or Flu-like symptoms, should not come to the courthouse. If you have a court hearing scheduled and cannot make it due to illness, please call us at (920) 496-7200 to arrange for a telephone or videoconference appearance or request a continuance in writing.
