- ➤ Goal: Expand Substance Abuse Treatment Services:
 - Review Community Needs for:
 - Detox Facility
 - Residential Facility
 - Transitional Living Facility



What is the Potential of Project CDC #21-112?

- Creation of an 8 to 10 Bed Facility
- ➤ Potential to Expand 14 to 16 Total Beds
- Capacity: Depends on Assessment of Male/Female Ratio
- > Ability to find and hire staffing to operate the facility

- Estimates Demand for OCHD Patient Population

 - ➤ Medically Supervised Alcohol and Drug Detox Center and/or;
 - Residential Treatment Center and/or;
 - Transitional Living

- Provide Summary
- Include Construction and Development Costs

Community Support Fund Law, Chapter 125

- "Catastrophic Illness/Injury" Involves In-patient Care
- ➤ Inpatient or Intensive Outpatient Treatment Assistance
- ➤ OCHD Referrals Licensed/Certified Counseling Agency or Program
 - Verifying the Catastrophic Illness
- ➤ Up to a Maximum of \$5,000.00 per lifetime
- No Residency Restrictions
