ONAYOTE?A·KÁ NI? I Standing Committee Charter

Authority

- 1. *Name*. The name of this entity shall be the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee and may be referred to as the I Am Oneida Standing Committee.
- 2. Establishment. The OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee is the project team for the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Project Plan approved by the General Tribal Council on July 24, 2023¹, and further established through the adoption of this charter.
- 3. *Authority*.
 - (a) Purpose. The purpose of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee is to serve on behalf of the General Tribal Council and Oneida Business Committee as it relates to the implementation of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Project Plan which was presented at the Annual General Tribal Council Meeting on January 30, 2023, and subsequently supported by General Tribal Council on July 24, 2023.
 - (b) Powers and duties. The powers of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee are advisory, with duties that include, but are not limited to the following:
 - (1) Assist with ensuring accurate and timely information is provided to the Oneida Community regarding relevant or associated enrollment projection data and projected impacts based on that data.
 - (2) Provide constructive input or advice to the General Tribal Council and Oneida Business Committee on matters relating the implementation of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Project Plan.
 - (3) Act as listening and communication agents on behalf of the community, by sharing general information, timelines or other matters relating to the implementation of the approved project plan.
 - (4) Ensure the Oneida Nation's Vision² and Mission³ are considered and incorporated.
 - (5) Responding to and acting upon any other delegated authority established through the laws, policies, rules and resolutions of the Oneida Nation.
 - (6) Create non-stipend sub-committees for the purpose of assisting in outreach and education regarding the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Project Plan, and whose

composition is representative of individuals who may be impacted by implementation of the plan.

Membership

- 4. *Membership*.
 - (a) Number of members. The Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall consist of not less than nine (9), nor more than fifteen (15) appointed members. Each member shall hold office until their term expires, until their resignation, or until their appointment is terminated in accordance with the Boards, Committees and Commissions law, section 105.6-2(c).
 - (1) The members shall be selected as follows.
 - A. Two members of the Oneida Business Committee selected at the beginning of each term;
 - B. Seven or more community members appointed by the Oneida Business Committee.
 - (2) Term Expiration. Although a member's term has expired, they shall remain in office until a successor has been sworn in by the Oneida Business Committee.
 - (3) Resignation. A member may resign at any time verbally at a meeting or by delivering written notice to the Oneida Government Administrative Office and the the Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee Chairperson or Chairperson's designee. The resignation is deemed effective upon acceptance by motion of a member's verbal resignation or upon delivery of the written notices.
 - (b) Appointment. The OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall be appointed by the Oneida Business Committee for a term of three (3) years. Terms shall start of the first day of the year (01/01) and shall end on the last day of the year (12/31).
 - (c) Vacancies. Vacancies shall be filled in accordance with the Boards, Committees and Commissions law, subsections 105.7-1(c) through (e).
 - (d) Qualifications of members. Members of the Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall meet the following qualifications:
 - (1) Be a member of the Oneida Nation.
 - (2) Age 18 or over on the date of submission of an application.

Officers

4. Officers. The Officer positions of the Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall consist of a Chairperson and a Vice-Chairperson.

- 5. *Responsibilities of the Chairperson*. The duties, responsibilities and limitations of the Chairperson are as follows:
 - (a) Shall call and preside over all meetings of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee.
 - (b) Shall appoint members to any task forces or subcommittees of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee.
 - (c) Shall have financial sign-off authority as set forth in section 8.
 - (d) Shall submit, or through a designee submit, annual and semi-annual reports, or other reports to the Oneida General Tribal Council, as well as quarterly reports to the Oneida Business Committee, in accordance with the Boards, Committees and Commissions law, sections 105.12-3 and 105.12-4.
 - (e) Shall represent and/or request another Officer to represent the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee at all regularly scheduled/unscheduled reporting requirements to the Oneida Business Committee and other business units of the Nation as may be requested, including, but not limited to, the Oneida Business Committee meeting in which the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee quarterly report appears on the agenda.
 - (f) In collaboration with the Vice-Chairperson and personnel from the Oneida Government Administrative Office, shall prepare agendas and handouts, submit any necessary paperwork to ensure stipends are paid, and perform other similar administrative functions, all in accordance with these bylaws, the Boards, Committees and Commissions law, section 105.12-1, and the Open Records and Open Meetings law.
- 6. *Responsibilities of the Vice-Chairperson*. The duties, responsibilities and limitations of the Vice-Chairperson are as follows:
 - (a) Shall preside over all meetings of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee in the absence of the Chairperson and may call emergency meetings.
 - (b) Shall have financial sign-off authority as set forth in section 8.
 - (c) In lieu of the Chairperson, shall represent the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee at all regularly scheduled/unscheduled reporting requirements to the Oneida Business Committee and other business units of the Nation as may be requested, including, but not limited to, the Oneida Business Committee meeting in which the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee quarterly report appears on the agenda.
 - (d) In collaboration with the Vice-Chairperson and personnel from the Oneida Government Administrative Office, shall prepare agendas and handouts, submit any necessary paperwork to ensure stipends are paid, and perform other similar administrative functions, all in accordance with this charter, the Boards,

Committees and Commissions law, section 105-12-1, and the Open Records and Open Meetings law.

- 7. Selection of Officers. Officers of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall be elected on an annual basis by a majority vote of the members in attendance at an OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee meeting of an established quorum for terms of one (1) year.
 - (a) The election of Officers shall take place within thirty (30) days after the newly appointed OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee members are present at their first scheduled regular meeting of an established quorum.
 - (b) On Ayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee members may be dismissed from their Officer position by consensus of the members in attendance at an On Ayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee meeting of an established quorum, excluding the officer subject to the vote.
 - (c) Vacant Officer positions shall be filled by consensus of the members in attendance at an OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee meeting of an established quorum.
 - (d) Members of the Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall not hold more than one (1) Officer position per Officer term.

Budget and Support

- 8. Budgetary Sign-Off Authority and Travel. The OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall follow the Nation's policies and procedures regarding purchasing and sign-off authority. Levels of budgetary sign-off authority for the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall be as set forth in the manual titled, Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin Purchasing Policies and Procedures, for Area Directors/Enterprise Directors.
 - (a) All Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee Officers shall have sign-off authority.
 - (b) Two (2) of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee Officers are required to sign-off on all budgetary requests, except as follows.
 - (1) The Oneida Government Administrative Office shall have sign-off authority over requests for stipends, travel per diem and business expense reimbursement.
 - (2) The Oneida Business Committee shall approve members' request(s) to travel on behalf of the Onayote?a ká ni? i Standing Committee.
- 9. Personnel. The Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall not have authority to hire personnel for its benefit. The Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee may receive administrative support from staff within the Oneida Government Administrative Office

that is consistent with the Boards, Committees and Commissions law for items such as preparing meeting agendas, documents and minutes; providing notice of meetings, meeting agendas, documents and minutes; recording meetings and meeting minutes; maintaining meeting agendas, documents and minutes; and submitting any necessary paperwork to facilitate stipend payments.

Meetings

- 10. Regular Meetings. Regular meetings of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall be held in accordance with a set schedule to be determined at the first meeting of the standing committee. The meeting will be either in person at the Norbert Hill Center, located at N7210 Seminary Rd., Oneida, WI 54155 or virtually via an agreed upon platform identified by the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee.
 - i Standing Committee and may change from time-to-time by majority vote of the members in attendance at an OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee meeting of an established quorum so long as notice is provided to all members in writing and, along with the public, in accordance with governing law, including, but not limited to, the Open Records and Open Meetings law, prior to the implementation of a new date, time and/or location.
 - (b) The Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee Officers and personnel from the Oneida Government Administrative Office shall work collaboratively to ensure all members, along with the public, are provided notice of meeting location, agenda, documents and minutes pursuant to these bylaws, as well as the Open Records and Open Meetings law, and that the meeting agenda, documents and minutes are prepared and packaged for the Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee members consistent with the Boards, Committees and Commissions law.
 - (c) Meetings shall be run in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order, decisions shall be made by consensus, and meetings shall be open to the public per the Open Records and Open Meetings law.
- 11. Quorum. All meetings of the Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall have at least a quorum in attendance, with quorum being defined as not less than seven (7) Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee members, one (1) of which is an Onayote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee Officer.
 - (a) A quorum shall be established at least five (5) minutes before the scheduled meeting time.
 - (b) Failure to establish a quorum will result in rescheduling of the meeting.

12. Voting. Decisions of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee shall be by consensus vote of the members in attendance at an OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee meeting of an established quorum. E-polls are permissible so long as conducted in accordance with the Boards, Committees and Commissions law. The Vice-Chairperson shall serve as the Chairperson's designee for the responsibility of conducting an e-poll in the absence or discretion of the Chairperson.

Stipends and Compensation

- 13. Stipends. On Nyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee members shall be eligible for the following stipends as set forth in this section. Provided that, Oneida Business Committee members appointed to this Standing Committee shall not receive a stipend.
 - (a) No more than two (2) per month, provided that for which a stipend of \$75 shall be paid for each meeting, provided that:
 - (1) A quorum was established;
 - (2) The meeting of the established quorum lasted for at least one (1) hour; and
 - (3) The member collecting the stipend was present for the entire meeting.
 - (b) A stipend for attending a duly called joint meeting between the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee and the Oneida Business Committee for which a stipend of \$75 shall be paid, provided that:
 - (1) A quorum was established by the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee;
 - (2) The joint meeting lasted for at least one (1) hour; and
 - (3) The member collecting the stipend was present for the entire joint meeting.
 - (c) For attending an event as defined in this subsection as approved by the Standing Committee.
 - (1) Stakeholder Summits or Community Meetings. A Standing Committee member shall receive \$25 per hour attended, provided that the Standing Committee shall identify the maximum hours which can be paid and the minimum hours which must be scheduled and attended.
 - (2) Specifically Directed Projects. A Standing Committee member shall receive a \$25 stipend per specifically directed project the scope of which is identified by memo and to specifically identified Standing Committee member(s). A specifically directed project includes, as examples and not limitation, representative presenting the quarterly report at an Oneida Business Committee meeting, representative on Facebook Live, or other social media activity.
 - (c) A stipend for attending a Judiciary hearing if the member's attendance at the Judiciary hearing was required by official subpoena.

- (d) Task force and subcommittee members shall not be eligible for stipends unless specific exception is made by the Oneida Business Committee or the Oneida General Tribal Council.
- 5-2. Compensation. Besides travel, per diem and business expense reimbursements authorized in accordance with the Nation's policy for travel and per diem, and by the Boards, Committees and Commissions law, sections 105.13-9, OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee members shall not be eligible for any other form of compensation for duties/activities they perform on behalf of the OnAyote?a·ká ni? i Standing Committee.
