Vision:

To be a leading Self-Governance Tribal Nation that promotes and expands Self-Governance authority and enhances Tribal Sovereignty to enrich the lives of the Oneida People.

Mission:

The Office of Self-Governance negotiates, oversees, and ensures compliance of the Nation's Indian Self Determination and Education Assistance agreements with federal agencies, and will promote and educate about the benefits of Self Governance to expand and strengthen Self Governance authority.

MAXIMIZE FUNDING

Pursue and secure recurring and one-time federal Self-Governance funding opportunities to enhance the Nation's programs and services.

Support the expansion of Self Gov and tribal

flexibility within federal agencies, and fully utilize SG authority within the Oneida Nation.

What is Tribal Self-Governance?


- Self-Governance is a Tribally-driven, legislative option, where Tribal governments are authorized by the ISDEAA to:
 - negotiate annual appropriated funding and
 - assume management and control of programs, services, functions, and activities (PSFA) that were previously managed by the federal government.
- Allows Tribes, as sovereign nations, to exercise their right to be self-governing and to take federal program funds and manage them to best fit the needs of their citizens and Tribal communities.
- Self-Governance provides reliable, annual base funding.
- The Nation has had a Self-Governance compact and multi-year funding agreement with the Indian Health Service to manage our healthcare operations since 1997.





Self-Governance Updates: Funding

2024 Health Center Funding by Source



- Oneida Health Center is funded through a combination of:
 - IHS Funding, through Self-Governance compact & funding agreement;
 - 3rd Party Revenue (Billing Medicare, Medicaid i.e. Badgercare, and Private Insurance)
 - Other grants and investment income
- All 3rd Party Revenue goes back into Comprehensive Health to operate healthcare programs
- No Tribal Contribution



Self-Governance Updates: Funding

- The Nation received 100% of its IHS funding for FY25, year ending 9/30/2025. No impacts to IHS funding this year.
- The White House is preparing to send its FY26 Federal Budget proposal to Congress.
- There are draft proposals to cut funding across many federal programs, <u>but these are just proposals</u> and are not final.
- Congress has the "power of the purse" and is the final decision-maker about whether to accept any cuts to the IHS.
- Congress is also debating proposals to reform or change Medicaid.





Self-Governance Updates

- Oneida Nation leadership and staff advocate to protect our federal resources and programs that serve tribes
- Congressional Testimony, Capitol Hill Visits, Agency Tribal Consultation, Tribal Advisory Committees, Letters, Lobbying, News Interviews
- Coordinate with National and Regional Tribal Organizations
- Tell our story, share impacts, and hold federal government accountable to its trust and treaty obligations

Healthcare Program Screenings

- **Generate 3rd party revenue for the Oneida Community Health Center.**
 - Help continue the process for Clinic Autonomy and Tribal Self-Governance.
- Continue to educate the community on access to FREE programs that help with medical costs and other programs that have a premium.
- **>** Begin with a phased approach to screenings.
 - Screenings will begin on May 12th, 2025
 - Future communication will be sent out pertaining to the next phases.



Available Healthcare Programs

BadgerCare Plus

✓ It helps low-income children, pregnant individuals and adults in Wisconsin.

> Wisconsin Well Woman Program

 Provides specific breast and cervical cancer screening services to lower income, uninsured, or underinsured clients.

Presumptive Eligibility for Pregnant Women

Provides coverage for prenatal care. Assistance to complete a full BadgerCare application is provided.

Family Planning Only Services for Men and Women

✓ Provides low to no-cost reproductive health care such as; contraceptives, STD testing, pregnancy testing, and voluntary sterilizations.

Purchased Referred Care Program

 Assists eligible patients with out-of-pocket costs for services done outside of OCHC if referred by an Oneida provider.

Health Insurance Marketplace

✓ A platform where individuals/families can shop and enroll for health & dental plans
