
Help prevent immunocompromised patients from getting sick

High Touch Areas

- High touch areas are the spaces that people constantly touch and are often forgotten during dayto-day cleaning.
- Please review this picture to know when items need to be cleaned.



How to use disinfectant wipes

- ► Each brand of disinfectant wipes has different instructions, so make sure you read them before use.
- Be sure to check the dwell time chart if you cannot find the dwell time in the container instructions
- Dwell Time:
 - otherwise known as a wet time or amount of time the surface needs to remain saturated

How to clean your department

Each department has their own SOP for environmental cleaning.

Each employee is responsible for reviewing the SOP.

Terminal Cleaning

- Terminal cleaning is the thorough cleaning/disinfection of all surfaces including floors and reuseable equipment
- ► This may be required in the following circumstances:
 - ► Following an outbreak or increased incidence of infection
 - Extra PPE was needed- COVID, influenza, RSV, chicken pox, MRSA, etc

Terminal Cleaning Cont.

- If a room in your department needs terminal cleaning:
 - Please place a sign on the door that the room is closed and write the time the door was shut and the time it may be opened
 - Door needs to remain closed for 30 min before custodial can enter
 - Call custodial at ext 6806 and inform them what time they may clean
 - Leave necessary PPE outside of the room for custodial to use or tell them what they will need before they come down
