Oneida Veterans Services Department

The Oneida Veterans Services Department is dedicated to providing quality services and assistance in the delivery of entitlements and benefits due to our Nation's veterans and their families. We accomplish this mission by consistently working to improve our processes for filing paperwork, and by learning about and providing resources for veterans throughout the state of Wisconsin. By working in collaboration with various chartered veterans' associations within Oneida, the Oneida Veterans Services Department provides community outreach in the forms of weekly Friday morning breakfasts and various Pig Roasts and Booyah events throughout the year.

On October 13th Veterans Services began accepting new/unopened toys for Toys For Tots. The last 2 years have been very successful with over \$7,500 worth of toys purchased from Wal-Mart, as well as countless donations of toys from community members. In continuing with that success, Veterans Services will be partnering with Oneida VFW Post 7784, as well as WIVA to purchase toys from Wal-Mart again this year. On December 12th, we will be joined by Marines from the US Marine Corps Reserve Center, Green Bay as they pick up the donations. Then, join us for Veterans Day when we will be hosting a meal for the community. More details will be provided later. Shortly after that, on November 20th, we gather along with ONVAC, VFW Post 7784, and WIVA as we provide hot dogs, brats, coffee and hot chocolate for the annual tree-lighting celebration. 

- Mid-winter is the beginning of our ceremonial cycle. We stir ashes to represent turning over the earth in preparation for the growing season. We are thankful and ask that all things on the

Speaker announces for each side to look for someone to open the "Stirring of the Ashes", one from each side to speak or sing. Speaker announces the person chosen from each side. Two men open Stirring Ashes, then the Faithkeepers. A man is chosen from each side of the house to handout paddles. The people are asked not to refuse the paddles.

Each side alternates as the people are given a chance to stir the

When all have stirred the ashes, the speaker, singer and all the title holders will stir the ashes again to close the stirring ashes ceremony.
