## **REMINDER: I-41 flyover ramp closures start next Tuesday on Green Bay's west side in Brown County**

*Construction begins Tuesday, July 7, 2026, and finishes in 2027*

(GREEN BAY WI) The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Northeast Region reminds motorists that full closures of I-41 flyover ramps at system-to-system interchanges on the city of Green Bay's west side begin Tuesday, July 7, 2026. The closures are part of a \$6.87 million contract to improve six flyover ramps on I-41 in Brown County and one flyover ramp in Winnebago County.

### **Project ramp locations**

- **I-41/I-43 interchange, Brown County:** Northbound I-41 to southbound I-43 southbound (over Velp Avenue); Northbound I-43 to southbound I-41 (over I-41); Northbound I-43 to northbound I-41
- **I-41/WIS 32/WIS 29 interchange, Brown County:** Southbound I-41 to westbound WIS 29 (over WIS 29); Eastbound WIS 29 to northbound I-41 (over I-41/WIS 29); Northbound I-41 to westbound WIS 29 (over I-41)
- **Winnebago County:** Northbound I-41 to northbound US 45 (over I-41)

### **Traffic impacts - General Information**

- Two-lane ramps will generally remain open during the day with lane closures.
- Single-lane ramps will be fully closed and detoured.
- Temporary evening and overnight full closures may occur for repair work.
- Lane closures may cause delays during peak travel times.
- Always check the project website for detour maps and specific dates and times.

### **Traffic impacts - I-41/WIS 29/WIS 32 System Interchange**

- **I-41 southbound to WIS 29 westbound – Full ramp closure begins **Tuesday**,**

**July 7** (one week).

- **Detour:** Use I-41 southbound Exit 168 C back to WIS 29 westbound.
- **I-41 northbound on-ramp from WIS 54/Mason Street – Full ramp closure begins Monday, July 13** to Saturday, August 1, 2026 (three weeks)
  - **Detour:** Take the I-41 southbound on-ramp at Mason Street, then use the I-41/Lombardi Avenue interchange (Exit 167) to U-turn and re-enter northbound I-41.
    - During the above Mason Street closure period the I-41 northbound to WIS 29 westbound two-lane ramp will have single-lane closures during the day and may have temporary evening/overnight full closures.
- **WIS 29 eastbound to I-41 northbound – Full ramp closure (dates TBD).**
  - Detour: Exit at WIS 29 eastbound to Packerland Dr. / Shawano Avenue, then proceed east on Shawano Avenue to the northbound I-41 on-ramp.

**Traffic impacts:** I-43/I-41 System Interchange (Dates TBD)

These three flyover ramps will remain open with single-lane closures.

- I-41 northbound to I-43 southbound
- I-43 northbound to I-41 southbound
- I-43 northbound to I-41 / US 41 northbound
  - Note: Short-term evening or overnight full closures may occur. No posted detours for overnight closures — follow signage.

**Traffic impacts: Winnebago County - Northbound I-41 to northbound US 45 (over I-41)**

- Work takes place in 2027 under a full closure of the ramp.

Motorists are encouraged to plan ahead, allow extra travel time, and check the official WisDOT project website for real-time updates, detour maps, and any schedule changes

## **Project improvements**

This is a bridge preservation project. Project improvements include milling a portion of the deck, performing deck repairs, and overlaying with a polyester polymer concrete (PPC) overlay at the six flyover ramps in Brown County. There will be a polymer overlay at the I-41 and US-45 system interchange ramp in Winnebago County in 2027.
