

Dear Oneida Sportsman,

For 2026-27, the Department is providing information for Land Notice, Registration & Harvest Report Details, Season Dates for Hunting & Fishing Regulations. A regulation book will not be issued; a copy can be found on the Oneida Nation website at:

Enclosed you will find your 2026-27 Oneida Sportsman license (**MUST** be signed and in your possession while hunting and fishing), registration & notice information, carcass tags, and the season dates.

NOTICE: ANY/ALL LOST OR MISPLACED LICENSE OR PERMITS WILL REQUIRE A \$25.00 REPLACEMENT FEE. THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS.

Designated Hunters:

Designated Hunter **MUST** obtain a valid 2026-27 license. Designated Hunter **MUST** register with the Department and are required to complete ALL harvest reports, after the season(s) close. Designated Hunters **MUST** harvest antlerless deer only.

HARVEST REPORTS: MUST BE COMPLETED FOR THE 2026-27 SEASON.

ALL HARVEST REPORTS MUST BE COMPLETED AT THE END OF EACH HUNTING SEASON, TO AVOID ADMINISTRATION FEE OF \$25.00 FOR THE 2027-28 LICENSE.

****NOTICE****

During 2025 & 26 season(s) there had been numerous complaints regarding individuals driving on property for a variety of activities, this includes hunting on land owned by the Oneida Nation.

Please be mindful that NOT all the fields and/or properties, particularly agricultural fields, are void of crops or established plantings. The Oneida Nation has several agricultural fields being utilized by the Oneida Nation Farm (ONF), Oneida Orchard Farm, and private tenants leasing agricultural property. The ONF, Oneida Orchard Farm, and Ag tenants are conducting a common practice of planting cover crops during the cool/cold season months.

This can entail seedling or established plant growth prior to the snow cover, and traffic on or during this time can negatively impact the cover crop. The Oneida Nation also has numerous properties that have restoration effort designations or protection guidelines with specific agencies, which call for restrictions on land uses. To ensure that these requirements are met, individuals conducting these illegal activities (example: driving across fields, driving off established lanes, etc.) will be cited for any/all violations that occur on these lands.

Violation:

52. Damaging property, Agricultural Crops, Or Restoration Areas.

Sanction:

1st violation - \$300.00 fine and loss of license for one (1) year, Total damage assessment costs.

2nd violation - \$600.00 fine and loss of license for Two (2) years, Total damage assessment costs.

This notification is being provided and ALL agricultural tenants/lease holders, along with the ONF and Oneida Orchard Farm. Staff are being informed to contact the Oneida Conservation Department or the Oneida Police Department to report any/all illegal activities.

The Nation has established contracts with numerous tenants/lease holders and other agencies, as well as the efforts of both the ONF and Oneida Orchard Farm, for the use of the land. The Nation wants to ensure that no activities conducted on agricultural, or any tribally owned lands are jeopardizing these lease agreements or damaging lands under specific contracts. The purpose of this notification and enforcement action is to maintain our long-term relationships with our community, respect current agricultural lease/land agreements, and protect the Nation's obligations. Your cooperation and assistance are a benefit to not only the land, but everyone involved in the utilization of the land.

We are asking everyone to use the proper judgement, obtain permission, and utilize established laneways to access tribal property.

NOTE:

*Bag limit will be six (6) ducks daily to include not more than one (1) Redhead, one (1) Hooded Merganser, two (2) Pintails, six (6) Wood Ducks, and six (6) Mallards (only three (3) mallards maybe hens).

**Mourning Dove season allows for the use of lead shot to harvest both male and female.

***Extended nine (9) day deer gun season upon the discretion of the Oneida Conservation Department.

Shooting hours will be from one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to one-half (1/2) hour after sunset.

Definitions:

Season: Open/Continuous season for all species

Panfish: Examples include Blue Gill, Sunfish, Pumpkinseed, Perch, Rock Bass, Crappie

Aggregated: Combination of species. Example: 5 perch and 5 bluegills=Total/Aggregate 10
