

Library Card Design Contest 2026

Show off your creativity and design a limited-edition Oneida Community Library card! A limited run of the winning designs will be printed and available during Native American Heritage Month (November) and distributed for the next year (while supplies last).

Submissions Deadline: September 25th, 2026

Voting: September 30th, 2026

Winner Announced: October 1st, 2026

Cards Available: November 2026 (Native American Heritage Month)

Eligibility

- Open to all ages 16+
- Participants must:
 - Be residents of Brown or Outagamie County
 - Hold a valid InfoSoup library card
- Limit one entry per person

Guidelines

- Designs must be artist's original and unpublished artwork (no copying, tracing, or copyrighted characters/logos)
- Digital artwork may be used by an artist in their process for creating their art. This could include, but is not limited to, Adobe Photoshop & Illustrator, Fresco, or Procreate. However, the digital construction method, including layers, unflattened working art of your digital file must be provided.
- Materials created by Artificial Intelligence (AI) either partially or wholly, are not allowed in submitted work. Further, the artist may not use any AI generated or Stock/Royalty Free artwork as part of their submitted piece. If there are questions, the Library Director will be the sole judge of acceptability.
- Artwork must be appropriate for all audiences. Absolutely no offensive or inappropriate content.
- Keep important elements away from edges (for printing purposes).
- Do not include personal identifying information on the design.
- Designs should reflect what you love about the library and the Oneida Community!
- Final card size: 3.375" x 2.125" (standard card size)
- Do not include personal identifying information on the design.

- By entering, participants grant OCL permission to reproduce and distribute the artwork and use designs for promotional purposes.

Submission Requirements

- Accepted formats:
 - Physical artwork (flat and scannable)
 - Digital files (JPEG or PNG, high resolution preferred)
- **Submit using the official contest template (PDF)**
- Drop off at Oneida Community Library- Main branch or submit to our email at oneidacommunitylibrary@oneidanation.org

Judging & Voting

- To avoid bias, judges will not be library staff but will be anonymous members of the Oneida community.

- One winner (16+)
- Winner announced On November 1st
- Winning designs will be printed as official library cards and available starting in November for Native American Heritage Month.

Official Judging Rubric (100 Points)

Criteria	Description	Points
Connection to Oneida Community & Library	Design reflects Oneida culture, values, community, language, history, contemporary life, and/or the importance of the library.	30
Creativity & Originality	Artwork demonstrates unique ideas, imagination, and a fresh artistic approach.	25
Visual Impact	Design is eye-catching, memorable, and effective at a small library card size.	20
Technical Quality	Artwork is clear, well-crafted, and suitable for printing. Digital or physical submissions show strong execution and attention to detail.	15
Adherence to Contest Guidelines	Follows all contest requirements, including originality, appropriate content, size/template specifications, and submission requirements.	10
